

APPROACH

Modern war - conflict ongoing in a continuous space between peace and war.

Grey zone - space in between peace and war in which state and non-state actors engage in competition.



PURPOSE



SURVEY RESULTS: RESPONDERS

34 respondents included senior leaders involved in professional military education (PME), serving military officers, civilian researchers, graduate students, and faculty in defence universities and staff colleges.

The survey was accessible to respondents in more than 20 countries, and 14 respondents indicated a willingness to continue to engage on the subject.


